## Water in the 2020 Virginia General Assembly

#### Final Version, January 27, 2021

The 2020 Virginia General Assembly session convened January 8 and adjourned March 7. The reconvened ("veto") session was held April 22. A special session called by Governor Ralph Northam to deal with impacts of the coronavirus pandemic began on August 18 and <u>adjourned November 9</u>. In the tables below (starting page 2), the Virginia Water Resources Research Center lists 211 measures in the regular session (January to March) of the 2020 Assembly dealing with water resources directly or indirectly, including two bills amending the current state budget that runs through June 30, 2020, and two bills setting the state budget for July 1, 2020-June 30, 2022 (as passed prior to the special pandemic-required session that started in August 2020).

The list was primarily generated from information on the Legislative Information System (LIS) Web site at <a href="http://lis.virginia.gov/">http://leg1.state.va.us</a> in a slightly different format), in the categories indicated by headings in the table. In addition to the bills identified by LIS category, several bills identified from a February 4, 2020, report by the Virginia Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts are shown on the last two pages of this document. Within each category, bills are listed in order of their bill number, using the following abbreviations: HB = bill started in House of Delegates; HJ = joint resolution started in the House; SB = bill started in the Senate; and SJ = joint resolution started in the Senate.

In the tables, numbers in the left-hand column have been added by the Water Center for cross-referencing among the bills. The second column from the left contains the actual bill numbers, hyperlinked to the LIS Web site. Click on the bill numbers to access more detailed bill information at the LIS site, including a summary of the bill and the chronology of legislative action. The bill titles and descriptions (third column from left) are taken from the LIS site, edited in some cases for clarity, space, or both. The right hand-column lists the fate of the bill.
